III. VISION FOR THE IAE (2015-2019)

The main objective of my nomination as President of IAE – the only international voice for Egyptology and Egyptologists worldwide – is to enhance the scientific cooperation between the international egyptological community and the concerned Egyptian authorities and universities. During the last twenty years, I have been in continuous contact with foreign egyptologists and with Egyptian colleagues, and I do believe in the necessity and importance of cooperation among the partners.

It is really surprising to find that fewer than forty Egyptian scholars and students are registered in the IAE, which shows that the impact of the association in Egypt needs to be improved. Egyptians should be actively involved in IAE activities, which will create very interesting networks to establish new scientific projects. There should be a national coordinator/secretary for Egypt to collect membership fees, to answer questions, etc.

As one of the fundamental aims of the IAE is to participate in the preservation of the cultural and historic heritage of Egypt, I am sure that there is no better time to vigorously activate it than now. I am confident that the IAE members worldwide can play an efficient role in detecting and identifying stolen objects circulating in international antiquities markets. I am also quite sure that they can support collecting funds and donations through NGOs and multinational corporations for better preserving, restoring and documenting Egyptian sites and objects. It is evident that the IAE is the best intermediary for providing funding and personnel for such activities.

The IAE should also actively coordinate with the Egyptian Ministry of Antiquities with regard to disseminating information about the new discoveries and archaeological work through the Association's website, and by using electronic communications systems (email, social media, etc.).

The IAE website should become an interactive focal point for egyptologists around the world through the establishment of a high quality forum that will facilitate cooperation among egyptologists and students. In my opinion, this forum will be the best way to get suggestions from egyptologists to express what they need and expect from the IAE.

Therefore, some work needs to be done on the website : the various B.A. and M.A. programs in which the field of Egyptology is involved should be completed ; the M.A. and Ph.D. subjects from Egypt and worldwide have to be added ; the links to research-based information and serious contents can be completed and updated ; the list of Egyptian egyptological institutions can be added, etc.

Furthermore, the references to Egyptian publications in Arabic language should be gathered, translated into a foreign language, and added to the OEB.

I think that there should be a great deal of cooperation/coordination between the IAE and related academic institutions and international organizations concerned with the field of Egyptology, such as ICOM, ICCROM, and UNESCO.

The IAE should also work on increasing regular and associate and student memberships. There could be coordination with the many national amateur associations and maybe offer special fees to their members. It seems that some professional Egyptologists only join because they are required to be members to present papers at the ICEs. There should be more reasons than that one.

Finally, I'll be honored to help in the organisation of the XIIth ICE in Egypt.
